(continued from page I) New barriers will help speeding on the green and footpaths. They will slow down motorcyclists and cyclists and maybe give police a chance to nab those who are going too fast and worrying other footpath users.

Other improvements on the way

Knightstone has permission from the council for other road improvements. Two planters near the top of Gilpin Close will provide a small 'pinch point'. This will encourage car drivers to slow down.

The council has agreed to install advisory road markings in Gilpin, though we don't have a date for that work yet.

Residents convince police to keep up the pressure


Thanks to your efforts, tackling speeding motorbikes on pavements around Gilpin
