The Area Wide Grant scheme is open for applications

South Gloucestershire Council is inviting applications from voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations and town and parish councils, for Round 2 of Area Wide Grants (AWG).

You can apply for grants to support community projects, activities or services that meet the needs of residents in at least six of the 14 Community Engagement Forum (CEF) areas in South Gloucestershire.

The deadline for applications in Round 2 is 15th October 2022.

Applications received by the deadline will be presented to a sub-group meeting for review. Recommendations from this meeting will be presented to the Executive Member for Communities and Public Health for a decision to be published in March 2023. Applications should therefore be for projects and services being delivered from April 2023.

All organisations must be registered to the Grants Online System and must be approved before making an application. For more information please see our Registration Guidance.

VITAMINDS SERVICES

Since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic, many people have experienced changes in their mental wellbeing and have for the first time needed to access services to help them.

We all experience difficult times when we feel like we can't cope. These incidents can affect your everyday life and prevent you from leading a normal life.

If you are suffering from depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder, excessive worry or low mood, then VitaMinds can help. VitaMinds works in partnership with the NHS to offer a range of short-term psychological therapies known as IAPT (Improving Access to Psychological Therapies) to adults 16-years and over, who live and are registered with a GP in Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire.

VitaMinds is a FREE service, and you don't need to visit a GP to get help – Vitamins are able to assist below who are experiencing depression, low mood due to physical conditions, excessive worry or anxiety, excessive worry about health, panic attacks, sleep problems, stress, phobias, obsessive compulsive disorder and experience of a traumatic event.

There are three main ways to contact Vitamins, a digital assistant that asks some questions and automatically refers you to the correct service, an online form that you can email to request services or call 0333 200 1893 to speak to an adviser. VitaMinds is not an emergency service and is not able to offer urgent help for crisis situations and will respond to any requests within 72 hours.

GREEN SOCIAL PRESCRIBING

The Covid-19 pandemic highlighted the need for people to spend time outdoors and the benefits for both a person's physical and mental health. Green social prescribing builds on the success of a social prescribing model. Social prescribing is a way for local agencies, mostly GP's, to refer people to a link worker. Link workers can offer people more time to talk about things that may not be medical problems but could be impacting their health. The link workers can take an holistic approach to people's health and wellbeing. Green Social Prescribing links people with activities that take place outdoors and may include joining a local allotment group, walking well or outdoor photography sessions. The Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire Integrated Care Board have produced a directory of available services which can be found at the One You South Glos page under Useful Mental Health Info page.

Dear Kingswood,

Hello from the Kingswood Neighbourhood policing team, we hope you have enjoyed the summer. We have had a busy time on the beat engaging with the community and dealing with issues reported by yourselves.

We have been dealing with reports of Anti-social behaviour and dealing with any issues we find at the location of the incidents.

We have completed two successful drugs warrants on the beat and have disrupted those involved, we are currently building a case to bring those persons involved to justice. We are unable to comment any further than that, but we are really pleased with the results.

You may have seen us in Cock Road and Tenniscourt road with our speed cameras, we do these following complaints from residents to get a picture of the speed of motorists using the roads results of which we share with our partner agencies.

We have completed several cycle marking sessions at Kingschase Shopping centre and at Warmley Tea rooms, we have had a great response from riders who want their cycles to be as secure as possible. If you would like to bring your cycle to us to have it security marked and details of your cycle loaded onto the BikeRegister National Cycle Database, please come along to our next event at the tea rooms on Sunday 25th September from 11am till 2pm.

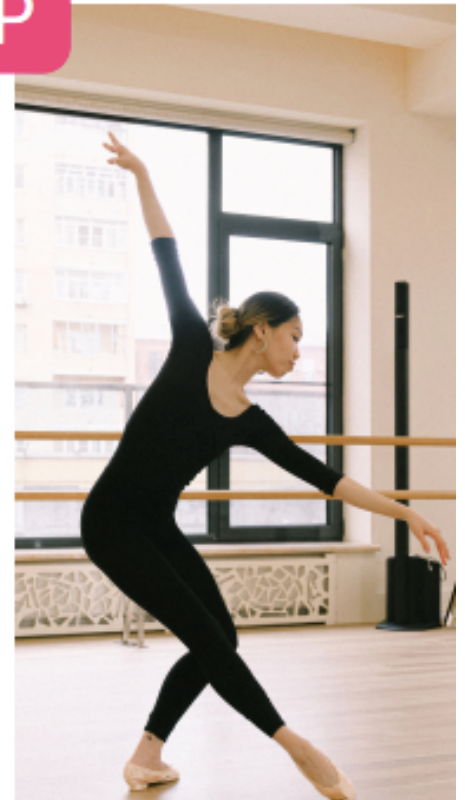

Nearly 300 people benefited from the programme over the 3 days and everyone said they had an amazing time.

DAY ONE

A community clean up and nature walk was organised to tidy the surrounding area, including Siston Common. Everyone who participated thoroughly enjoyed it and were all able to make a difference to the environment by collecting several black bags of litter. Everyone returned to the hub for free refreshments at K@ME Hub's Cafe. After a well-earned break, families and individuals were able to plant their own vegetable and flower seeds into pots, which were provided by K@M4E. This allowed everyone to experience nature and the children were able to take their planted seeds home to nurture and watch them grow. Children and Young People were kept engaged in games and fun activities by our Activities coaches. Everyone relaxed in the afternoon with a movie in the sports hall and enjoyed the sweet cones and popcorn!



DAY TWO

A family picnic was planned with free food provided by the K@ME Hub Cafe. The lovely weather meant that people were able to enjoy the community hub garden and be out in nature. Sporting and games activities were led by Children and Young People activity coaches in the outdoor sports court and the children were able to use the arts and crafts materials which were provided by K@ME.

Nature and Mass Planting Event



On 1st October Kingsmeadow@MadeForever (K@M4E) hosted a Nature and Mass planting event delivered in partnership with West of England Combined Authorities (WECA), South Gloucestershire Council Commons Connection Project and Friends of Siston Commons. The objective of the event was to encourage people to engage and connect with nature in their local community, provide an opportunity for people of all ages and backgrounds to participate in creating a wildflower meadow in Siston Common so they could take pride in their surroundings having played a role in the planting and to support pollinators, like bees because they are vital for our future sustainability. It was also aimed to provide a nature themed fun day activities enjoyed by families and individuals in the community, creating a sense of common care for our environment and each other.



One of the most significant issue facing our generation is the climate crisis, the event provided awareness of environmental challenges and information on how we can care for and nurture the environment on a local level.

Throughout the day, we had lots of nature themed activities engaging families, adults, children and individuals from the community. Many joined our team and built 2 large bug hotels made from recycled pallets, leaves and bits donated or found around the hub. Councillor Toby Savage, head of South Gloucestershire Council (SGC) and fire officers from A&E added their personal touch to the bug hotels. Paul Volker (SGC public health) and Cheryl King (Juice Community Project) who both played a major role in building the hotels named them **Leaf Lodge** and **Bark Hotel**. We provided information on “How to build your own bug hotel at home”. Everyone is welcome to visit the Bug hotels at K@M4E Community Hub.



The children from K@M4E Art and Comic Club had a special opportunity to present their art work of this term which focused on caring for our planet, to the Mayor of West of England Combined Authorities (WECA), Mayor Dan Norris.

The children later joined the mayor planting wildflowers at Siston Commons to support pollinators. The children and their families have told us they very much enjoyed the event. Our Art & Comic Club was generated by two year 6 children from “The Tynings Primary School” in our community. It runs every Saturday 3-5pm and is open to children aged 6-12 of all levels of experience/skill.



In the K@M4E hub garden, individuals and families planted seeds in plant pots which were given to them to take home to nurture and grow. Other activities such as nature theme face painting, nature bingo, climbing wall and live music created an enjoyable environment for everyone. There were information stands including Travel-West, who educated about sustainable transport and access to e-scooters, SGC Public Health gave information on green social prescribing and SGC Community Learning promoted nature and wellbeing courses. Dr. Bike from Bike Bristol repaired bikes on site and gave useful tips on bike maintenance.

There were amazing attractions such as A&E Fire Brigade who attended with their fire-engine and allowed the public including children to learn about their work and explore the fire engine. Bird of Prey Discovery allowed people to hold an Owl and provided information which was very exciting for children and adults.

K@M4E team took their turn and planted 80 plant plugs at the planting site on Siston Commons. Over 7,000 plant plugs were planted on Siston Common by the community which was an incredible achievement within 1 day

The feedback we received from the event was overwhelmingly positive, people enjoyed every aspect of the event. One participant said “it is amazing to have all the different activities going on at the hub alongside the planting at the Siston Commons”. A family said, ‘it was good to take part in making a difference’ and another remarked that it was ‘a great event raising awareness and community involvement’.

K@M4E community hub aims to strengthen a sense of community and prevent loneliness and isolation. We are pleased that it was an all inclusive fun event that got everyone of all background engaged. The atmosphere was fantastic! We would like to say a big "Thank You" to the our wonderful community of great people, volunteers, WECA and all the participants who contributed to the success of the event.

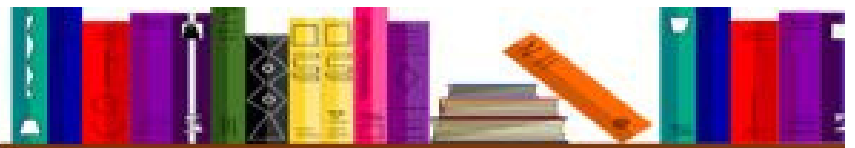

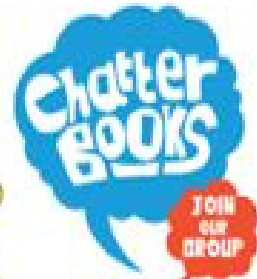

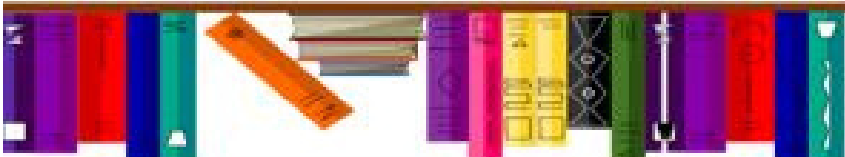
